Classwork Corner - K6D

K6D have had a busy start to Term Four. In class, the students are continuing to work hard in the ongoing development of their literacy and numeracy skills through a variety of classroom activities in our morning and middle sessions. Students have benefited in their learning from having daily assistance from our School Learning Support Officers; Robyn, Phoebe and Maddy. In Science we have continued investigating Living Things with our germinated sunflower seeds from Term Three flourishing and hopefully close to flowering. This term we have been studying types of animals and how they are classified into different groups based on certain characteristics. Our art lessons this semester have followed our theme of animals and this week we will be creating artwork related to an animal from the reptile family. Maybe a snake or a crocodile. In Aboriginal Language this semester with Robyn we have been learning about kinship and the names of native animals. Students have enjoyed these lessons that always end with a game of Lingo Bingo. In History we are continuing to look at the early days of European colonisation from the perspective of both indigenous and non-indigenous Australians. Last term we explored the life of convicts in the colony and this term we have learnt about the warrior, Pemulwuy and his resistance to European colonisation. This week in our History lesson we will investigate Woollarawarre Bennelong and his relationship with Governor Arthur Phillip.
